Journaling Recommended States

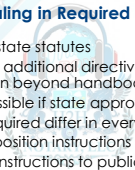
- Recommended means flexibility
- Short cuts where it makes sense
- Ability to make copy for title or public
- Use of e-journal or any hard copy style

Journaling in Required States

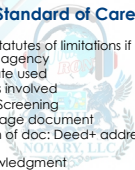
- Must follow state statutes
- Look for any additional directives/interpretation beyond handbook
- E-journal possible if state approves
- Elements required differ in every state
- Specific Disposition instructions
- Photocopy instructions to public

Standard of Care

- Destroy after statutes of limitations if not required to return to state agency
- Loose certificate used
- Witness names involved
- Observations/Screening
- Foreign Language document
- Full description of doc; Deed+ address of property, Type of deed
- Verbal acknowledgment

Journal Example from CA SOS Newsletter
 Typical Required columns: Date & Time (MD, MO, NY, TX) Type of Notification, Document Name (TX date), Name & Address (except CA), WA, AB, NY not required. If keep other documentation

Journal Sample from CA SOS Newsletter
 Typical Required columns: ID description, Print Name (not CA, NY), Fee Jurisdiction (CA, MD, MA, IL, NY, TX) Signer Signature (not required CA, NY, TX) Transcription CA FORM 52. (Other states optional to collect except TX)

Work Smarter

- Why do we need to be more efficient at a signing?
 - Fit more assignments in the work day
 - Spend less time on a lower paying job
 - Build buffer time for calls, drops, breaks in-between
 - Minimize pain from carpal tunnel, arthritis
 - Balance efficiency and effectiveness

Work smart

- 4 areas to streamline Journaling
 - Prepare before you go
 - Include journaling as you present
 - Use wording/date stamps ie: acknowledgment
 - Journal entry short cuts where allowed

Work Smarter

- 2 methods to save time:
 - Proactive management
 - Conversation with signers
 - Prep of package/notary instructions
 - Table set up: use both sets of documents
 - Instructions to signers
 - Documentation shortcuts
 - Certificate/Journal Stamps
 - Utilizing out of state certificates when allowed
 - Utilizing other journal shortcuts allowed by law

Work Smarter

- Journal Entries
 - For states that do not require journal take short cuts for multiple documents/signers repetitive information
 - Use Abbreviations like ACK, other common ones
 - For states where journal required: take shortcuts where allowed for repetitive information
 - Use stamps for date, notarial act, ID column, common document ie: Deed of Trust

Remember

- NSA's who are certified agreed to keep a journal even if state does not require it.
- Journals in states where required may be audited by SOS for compliance, in response to a complaint, or in cases of fraud.
- Journal is evidence of your fulfilling your notarial obligations- Best Protection
